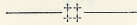

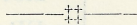

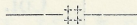
DINNER

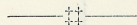
Souvenir Cups and Saucers

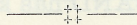
"Relic Hall"

containing articles ranging from 75 years to 500 years old, will be open to the public during the day. Admission, irrespective of age, five cents.

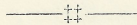


The Brass Cannon,
